#### What is the purpose of this update?

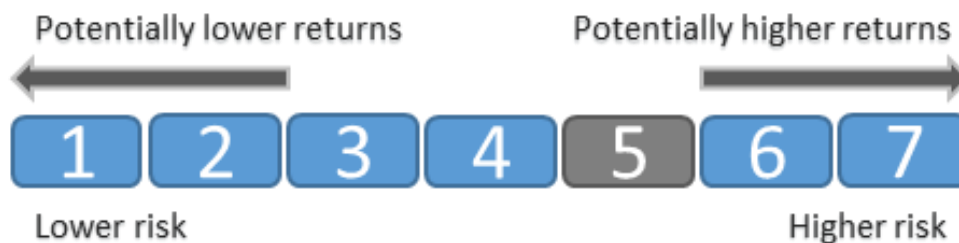
#### Description of this fund

The Fund is an ethical portfolio with a higher exposure to growth assets and a lower exposure to income assets. This Fund's value is likely to fluctuate more than the Balanced Fund or Conservative Fund.

#### What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the CareSaver Growth Fund

## Example of how this applies to an investor\*

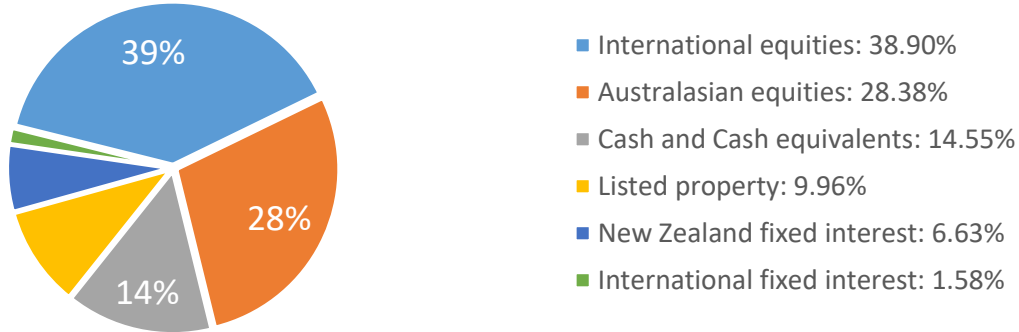
Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

Tara had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Tara received a return of \$2,241 (that is 22.41% of her initial \$10,000). Tara also paid \$27 in other charges. This gives Tara a total return after fees, charges and tax of \$2,232 for the year.

*Currency hedging:* Changes in the value of the NZ dollar relative to other currencies can have a big impact on your investment over the long term. The target currency hedging level implemented in the fund is 50% (actual hedging level at 31 December 2020 was 57.65%) of the foreign currency exposure (this will change over time). Total unhedged foreign exposure is 20.11% of the net asset value of the Fund at 31 December 2020 (this will change over time).

## Notes

- 1) **Risk indicator:** This risk indicator is not a guarantee of a fund's future performance. Market index returns as well as the fund's actual returns have been used to fill in the risk indicator because the risk indicator is calculated using returns data for the five-year period ending on 31 December 2020. Market index returns have therefore been used for the period from 1 January 2016 to 23 July 2019 when the fund was not in existence or available for investors, and actual fund returns have been used since then. As a result of those returns being used, the risk indicator may provide a less reliable indicator of the potential future volatility of the fund. While risk indicators are usually relatively stable, they do shift from time to time. The risk indicator will continue to be updated in future fund updates.
- 2) **Annual return:** Return after deduction of fund charge and tax is higher than return after deduction for fund charge but before fees. This is due to tax refund for losses on non-FDR hedging contracts.
- 3) **'Cash at Bank':** The fund uses foreign currency cash accounts which can be both positive and negative balances. If all cash positions are netted, the overall cash holding in NZD is 14.22% of the fund net assets.
- 4) **Key Personnel:** James Caughey, Nish Vyas, and Kent Fraser have not been named in a previous fund update.
